Typical duties include:

- Collaborate with municipal staff to locate all above ground municipal assets (manholes, valves, hydrants, culverts, sidewalks, buildings, roads, signs, etc.);
- Use a hand-held GPS device to collect asset location information;
- Assess, document and photograph the condition of assets; and,
- Collaborate with Urban colleagues to update GIS dataset for each community.

While the project is managed out of our Saskatoon branch, the person in this role will be based out of their home location, in and around the communities in west central Saskatchewan.

The salary range for this position will be \$16-18 per hour based on a 40-hour work week and dependant on the successful candidates' skill and abilities. An allowance for mileage associated with work-related travel will also be included, over and above the hourly wage.
